SOME EXAMPLES OF INFORMATION REQUIRED:

- Consider any student government involvement throughout your educational career.
- Include any student government office(s) you have held during any part of your educational career.
- List any community service activity (Boy/Girl Scouts, Blood Drives, Church activity, etc.) in which you have been directly involved.
- Consider all office(s) you have held or activity in clubs/organizations.

NOMINATION:

Eligibility for competition in the JFK Lancer Scholarship program is by nomination. Students or Teachers should be nominated by their guidance counselors, (fellow) teachers, principals, headmasters or headmistresses. A student or teacher may also enter a nomination on his/her own behalf with an additional reference. An interview by a JFK Lancer representative will also be required.



QUESTIONS:

What should my nomination and references include?

- Student applicants, a personal reference with examples of how your leadership skills and research into the JFK assassination have made significant contributions to your class, school or community.
- Teacher applicants, a professional reference with examples of how your leadership skills have lead to

student research into the JFK assassination and how your own research has made significant contributions to your school, students and community.

How will I know if I receive a scholarship?

The student and teacher selected are notified in writing through a "Scholarship Notification" letter and/or call.

How are scholarships used to pay educational costs?

A check will be issued directly to you at the November Conference.

What is expected of me as a scholarship recipient?

You **MUST** attend the "November In Dallas" Conference in November. Recipients will be officially awarded at the "November In Dallas" Conference Awards Banquet held in Dallas, Texas, in November. You will read your essay at the Awards Banquet. Certain expenses will be paid by JFK Lancer.**

*Student scholarship is a nonrenewable \$500 cash award. Teacher award is a nonrenewable \$500 cash award & \$100 in materials from JFK Lancer Resource Mail Order. JFK Lancer has the right to withhold the award in either category if applications submitted are deemed unsatisfactory. Selection will be made a scholarship panel and decisions are final. 2001 awards are limited to persons living in the continental United States.

**Expenses will be limited only to the actual recipients and not to family members or escorts. Expenses will be limited to partial travel and one (1) night's lodging for the Dallas Conference. Other limitations may apply.

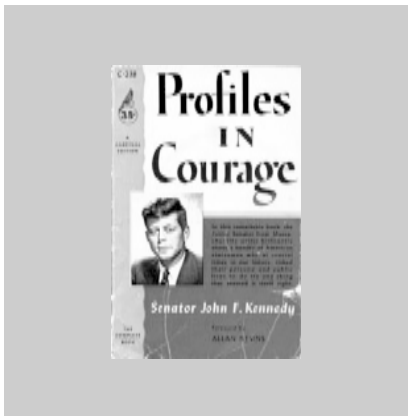

 *Each applicant will receive a complimentary copy of JFK's Pulitzer Prize winning book, "PROFILES IN COURAGE."*

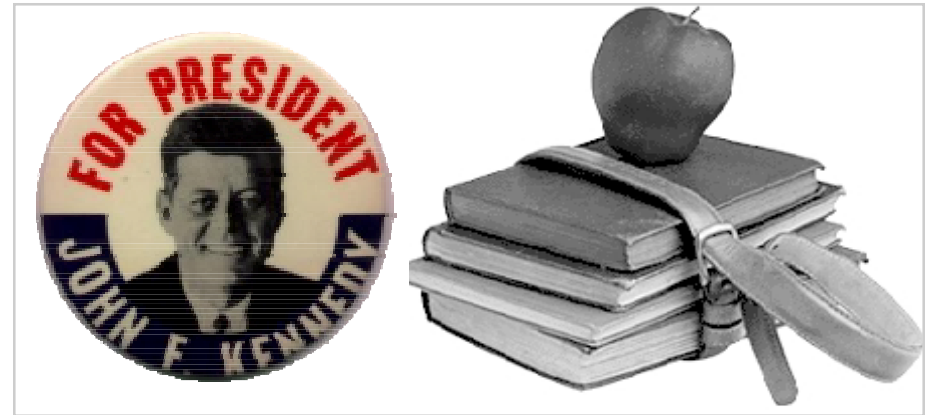
SCHOLARSHIP INFORMATION

Since 1995, JFK Lancer has donated hundreds of dollars' worth of research materials to students, teachers, schools and libraries. We are committed to the our goal of educating people by making research materials available for everyone. That's why we have decided to put our commitment in action in a different and meaningful way. This means CASH awards for a selected student and teacher to be awarded each November*

STUDENT SCHOLARSHIP:

We are looking for a young person who has demonstrated leadership qualities in the classroom as well as in student activities. This student should have a standard of excellence in research contributions to the study of the assassination of President John F. Kennedy. The scholarship is \$500 and \$100 in research materials.

Applicant must be under 21 years of age high school seniors entering their first year of full-time study accepted for enrollment at an accredited college, university, or community college.



The JFK Lancer Scholarships are sponsored by the Mary Ferrell Legacy Project.

Applicant must:

- have completed a minimum of 24 credit hours by school year end,
- have a minimum 2.5 cumulative GPA,
- submit two letters of recommendation. (see "Nomination")
- include a record of extracurricular leadership activities. (see guidelines)
- include examples of their classroom JFK project. (video, photographs, research paper, field trips, etc.)
- submit a typed, 500 word essay titled: "Why the Assassination of President John F. Kennedy Still Matters."

TEACHER SCHOLARSHIP:

We wish to reward a teaching professional who has demonstrated leadership and dedication in teaching young people the assassination events in the classroom. This teacher should have set a standard of excellence in research for their students to strive for and personally contributed information to the understanding of the

murder of President John F. Kennedy.

Recognizing the need for ethical leadership in the 21st century and the increasingly important role of teachers as leaders, JFK Lancer offers the JFK Lancer Scholarship for Teachers who demonstrate characteristics of leadership. The scholarship is \$500 cash and \$100 value of research materials.

Applicant must:

- Be full-time, certified teacher at high school level, teaching the assassination as an independent class or as part of another class subject.
- Submit examples of their JFK classroom project. (video, workbook, class outlines, field trips, listing of students' research, etc.)
- Two references (see "Nomination")
- submit a typed, 500 word essay titled: "Why the Assassination of President John F. Kennedy Still Matters."
